

Build your knowledge and skills in investigating psychosocial safety hazards and incidents.

This program is designed to help people and safety professionals build confidence and capability in investigating complex workplace incidents and complaints. Participants will learn to consider how psychosocial hazards and factors may have contributed to various incident types, including physical injuries, unsafe work practices, psychological injuries from poor work design, workplace bullying, sexual harassment, and violence.

Targeted at both Australian and international audiences, the program focuses on meeting the requirements of work health and safety and industrial relations laws in Australia. Over 10 weeks, the content is highly practical, requiring participants to apply their knowledge through three key activities introduced during the lectures. Additionally, participants can learn from like-minded colleagues, sharing tips and brainstorming solutions for implementing leading practices in psychological health and safety management.

The online delivery format allows learners to join from anywhere in the world. For those unable to attend live sessions, recordings are shared the day after delivery.

Program Overview

1. Foundations in Psychosocial Safety Investigation

Understand the purpose of a psychosocial safety investigation, when to do one, and key considerations in process. In the opening session we will consider the legal requirements for investigations and where they fit within a broader psychosocial safety management strategy. You'll be introduced to the pros and cons of existing approaches to investigation in HR and WHS, considerations around how to design investigation processes, and how to align both functions to ensure effective investigation outcomes.

Activity: Perform a gap analysis of your current psychosocial safety investigations practices.

2. Carrying out a Psychosocial Safety Investigation

Explore practical methods and strategies for planning and scoping investigations, ensuring a person-centred and trauma-informed approach. You'll be guided through how best to gather information about psychosocial hazards and incidents and establish facts versus assumptions. Learn to investigate root causes of psychosocial factors, determining key contributing factors across individual, team and organisational levels to best inform follow-up actions.

Activity: Complete a practical root cause analysis on a current issue or incident.

3. Psychosocial Safety Investigation Findings and Follow-up

In the final session, consider how to close out investigations with well executed recommendations. You'll build knowledge in how to identify appropriate risk controls for hazards identified, applying frameworks such as the Hierarchy of Controls. Learn practical approaches you can adopt in documenting corrective actions and guiding follow-up once investigation findings are handed back to key stakeholders.

Activity: Complete a risk assessment as part of a formal or informal investigation process.
